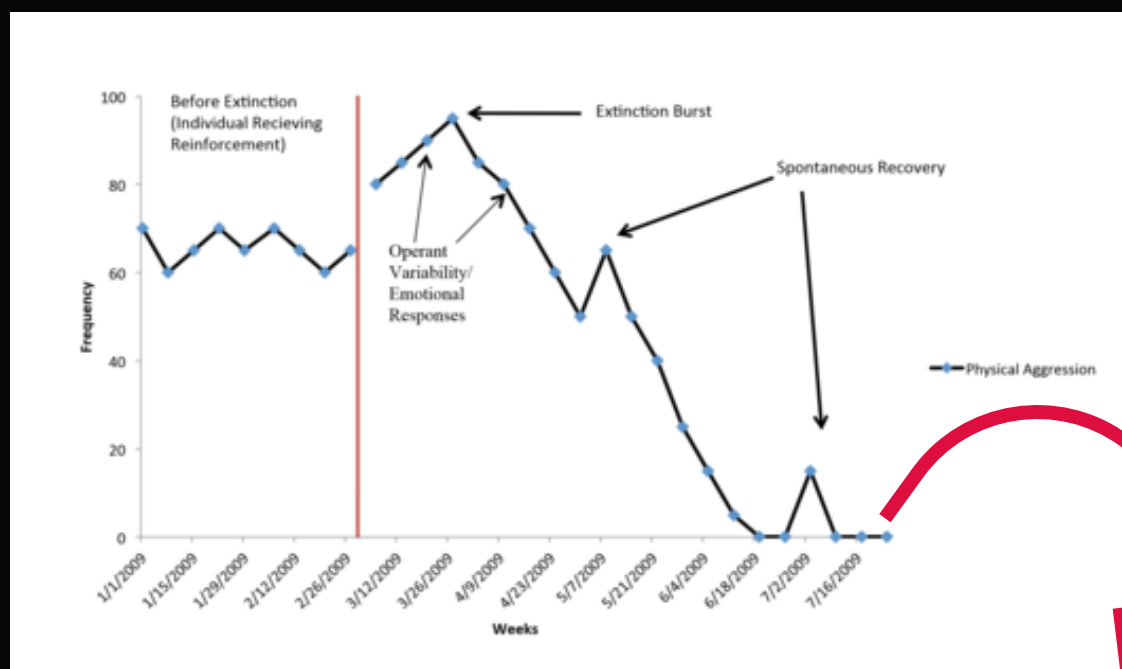


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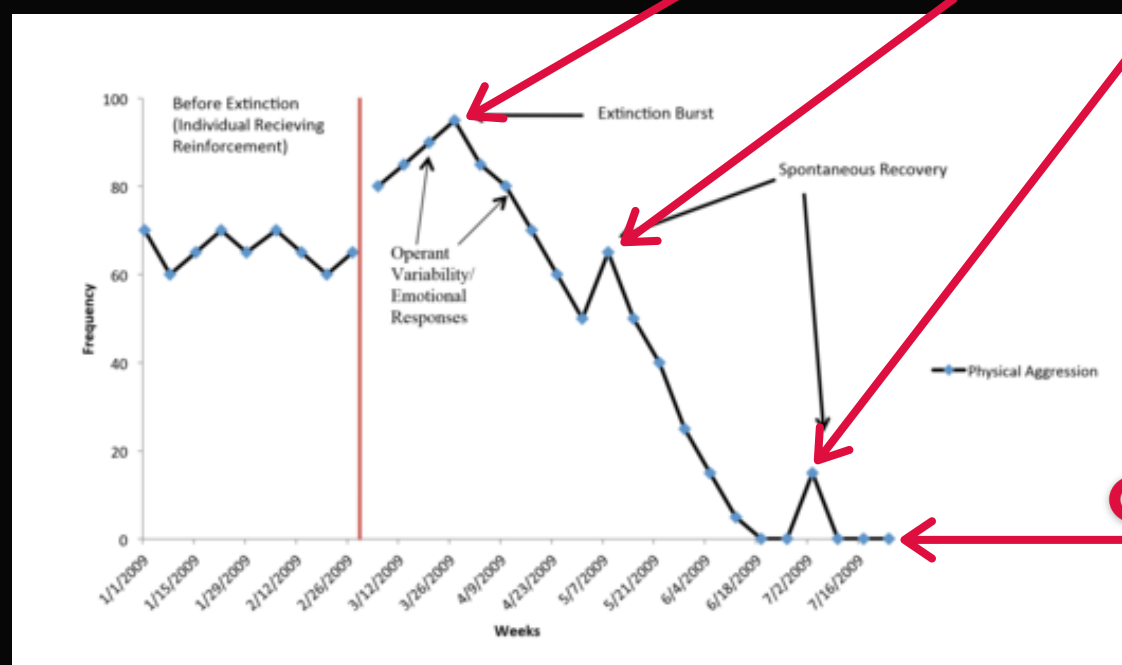
The graph below was extracted from an online ABA study guide. It was originally used to show an "extinction burst" and two "spontaneous recoveries," ultimately reporting "extinguished behaviors." The blue points represent "aggressive behaviors" observed. This is what ABA therapists expect to see when they are "extinguishing behaviors."
